



Senorita Captures Sixth World Championship Title

Senorita captured the American Mule Racing Association World Open Championship with her final race of the season in Fresno, Calif., on October 12, 2019. In a 440-yard sprint, she cleared the field, defeating her closest contenders by nearly two lengths, securing the Fresno AMRA Gold Cup. This marked her fifth consecutive year to win the World Championship title and her sixth time overall. The challenge requires superior performance throughout the race year against former World Champion BJF Red Ticket and other fast racing mules, including BJF Cowboy Way and Penelope.

Senorita is an 9-year-old dapple grey molly bred by Roger Downy and owned by Gayle Stegmann and David Wood. She is trained by Ruby Thomas and Peggy Hanford and was ridden to her championship race by jockey Jose Dominguez.

Watch for Senorita on the California State Racing circuit again in 2020 as she vies for her seventh World Championship title.
